

PATIENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Associated Urological Specialists promotes the rights of our patients, in compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and standards. Therefore:

- You have the right to be fully informed in advance about care/service to be provided, including the disciplines that furnish care and the frequency of visits, as well as any modifications to the plan of care/service.
- You have the right to be informed of your financial responsibilities in advance of care being provided.
- You have the right to receive information about the scope of services that the organization will provide and specific limitations on those services.
- You have the right to participate in the development and periodic revision of the plan of service.
- You have the right to refuse care or treatment after the consequences of refusing care or treatment are fully presented.
- You have the right to be informed of client/patient rights under state law to formulate an Advanced Directive, if applicable
- You have the right to have one's property and person treated with respect, consideration, and recognition of patient dignity and individuality.
- You have the right to identify the staff member of the program, including their job title, and to speak with a staff member's supervisor, if requested.
- You have the right to be free from mistreatment, neglect, or verbal, mental, sexual, and physical abuse, including injuries of unknown source, and misappropriation of patient property.
- You have the right to voice grievances/complaints regarding treatment or care, lack of respect of property or recommend changes in policy, personnel, or care/service without restraint, interference, coercion, discrimination, or reprisal.
- You have the right to have grievances/complaints regarding treatment or care that is (or fails to be) furnished, or lack of respect of property investigated.

 - Reports made to AUS will be investigated, documented, and responded to with attempted resolution within 14 business days
- You have the right to confidentiality and privacy of all information contained in the patient record and of Protected Health Information.



- You have the right to be advised on the organization's policies and procedures regarding the disclosure of clinical records.
- You have the right to choose a health care provider, including choosing an attending physician, if applicable.
- You have the right to receive appropriate care without discrimination in accordance with physician orders, if applicable.
- You have the right to be informed of any financial benefits when referred to an organization.
- You have the right to be fully informed of your responsibilities, as stated below.

Patient Responsibilities

- You are responsible for submitting forms that are necessary to receive services to the extent required by law.
- You are responsible for providing accurate medical and contact information and notify staff of any changes in this information.
- You are responsible for notifying the treating provider of participation in the services provided by the organization.
- You are responsible for notifying our staff of any concerns about the care or services provided.
